

Our Community Wealth Building pillar provides culturally relevant education and bilingual resources tailored to current and emerging entrepreneurs who are committed to the Little Village community.

All of our services are provided at **no cost** to participants and offered in Spanish or bilingual English/Spanish.




### **Growing The Xquina Business Ecosystem**

The Xauina Business Ecosystem connects current and emerging entrepreneurs to a wide range of solution driven services—including mentorship, entrepreneurial cohorts, micro-grants, business development, technical assistance, and more—through a network of strategic alliances and partnerships. Within this dynamic ecosystem, entrepreneurs thrive by accessing culturally responsive, industry-specific resources tailored to their unique business needs.

Our partners are vital to the success of the Xquina Business Ecosystem. They provide essential community support, business programs, and technical services.

Among these key contributors is the Fund for Equitable Business Growth, which has made many of these collaborations possible by convening local business service providers to deliver culturally relevant resources to entrepreneurs.



### Little Village Economic Empowerment Center: Path to Growth

The Foundation launched the Little Village Economic Empowerment Center following a generous contribution by the State of Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity. This funding enabled us to accelerate the growth of the Xquina Business Ecosystem with the following key milestones and service offerings:



Increased Staff: We hired two new key staff members, a Program Director and Client Services Manager, to support the program initiatives and expand client services

### **Business Finance Resources: Expanding Access to Capital**

With the help of dedicated funders like the Chicago Community Trust's We Rise Together initiative, we expanded our service offerings to include more business financial support. More opportunities for financial literacy, individual support, and an increase in capital investment are frequently requested by our constituents. This year, we expanded our services!

- Increased Staff: We contracted an Access to Capital Manager to develop, deliver, and support the Micro Lending program
- One-on-One Financial Support: Entrepreneurs can now receive business finance-related support and guidance, including assistance with translation services and loan applications
- Coaching: Our staff work with small businesses to get them ready for capital investment
- In 2025, we will further expand into offering micro-loans!

**Elevating Juntos Entrepreneurial Classes** 



Juntos Entrepreneurial Classes, our flagship program, has been the foundation of our services since we opened our doors in 2018. In our second year of offering English classes in addition to Spanish-led instruction, the Foundation reaffirms its commitment to inclusivity and accessibility. This bilingual approach ensures that all entrepreneurs—regardless of language preference—can engage with meaningful, culturally relevant resources and receive the support they need to succeed.

Atalia World LLC is a shining example of resilience, growth, and the transformative power of community. Led by Marileenny Figuera—a determined and passionate entrepreneur—Atalia World reflects a journey fueled by love, purpose, and supported by Juntos Programs.

A Venezuelan immigrant who arrived in the U.S. just five years ago, Marileenny founded Atalia World with a deeply personal mission: to help cover her mother's breast cancer treatment. What began as a heartfelt endeavor has since grown into a thriving business specializing in personalized products like cups, stickers, and tote bags. Every item is crafted with intention, carrying messages of mental health, self-worth, and motivation. Through her creations, Marileenny hopes to remind women of their strength and inspire them to embrace their value.

Marileenny is a proud alumna of the Foundation's suite of entrepreneurial programs—Juntos Lanzamos, Juntos Emprendemos, and Juntos Avanzamos—which supported her development from aspiring business owner to established entrepreneur. Earlier this year, Atalia World was awarded a \$2,000 micro-grant, which allowed Marileenny to invest in new resources, such as her website, and expand her reach.

Her growth didn't stop there. Recognizing her talent and dedication, the Foundation of Little Village invited her to lead a webinar on holiday marketing strategies—an opportunity for Marileenny to give back by sharing her knowledge with fellow entrepreneurs. Soon after, she was selected to serve on the newly launched Xquina Advisory Board, composed of alumni from the Juntos programs. As a founding member, she now plays a key role in guiding and mentoring the next generation of entrepreneurs.

Marileenny's journey from mentee to mentor is a powerful testament to the strength of education, community, and purpose. She is an immigrant, a caregiver, a mother, a business owner—and now, a mentor and leader. Through Atalia World LLC, she continues to uplift others, proving that with determination and support, transformation is possible.

### Viva La Horchata: Growth Through Every Pour

#### **Maria Alvarez**

Foundation Services Rendered: Juntos Emprendemos, Advising

In 2024, Maria Alvarez stood behind her horchata cart at the Little Village farmers market, facing yet another day of unsold product. Her traditional recipe—rooted in her hometown of Guerrero, Mexico—carried the warmth of home and family. Yet despite her passion, Maria struggled to turn her dream into a sustainable business.

"I would cry every time I had to throw away my horchata," she recalls. "It felt like I was pouring away a piece of myself."

Everything changed the day she was introduced to the Foundation of Little Village's Juntos Emprendemos program.

Through this culturally responsive entrepreneurship initiative, Maria gained the tools and confidence she needed to transform her passion into a thriving business. She learned how to market her product, engage with customers, and refine her brand. Most importantly,

she found a community that believed in her.

On October 9, 2024, Maria graduated from Juntos Emprendemos. As part of her capstone presentation, she shared her journey—honestly, emotionally, and without pretense. Her heartfelt story and entrepreneurial growth earned her first place among her cohort.

Today, Viva La Horchata is no longer just a dream—it's a growing business. Maria continues to share the flavors of her heritage with the community, one cup at a time.

"I'm so grateful to the Foundation of Little Village," Maria says. "Because of Juntos Emprendemos, I found my voice, my strength, and a path forward for my business."

Maria's story is one of more than 100 entrepreneurs supported in 2024 through our small business programming. Her success reflects the core of our mission: to uplift community talent and create pathways for economic self-determination.

## **Economic Impact:**



Has seen remarkable growth, evolving from selling once a week at a local farmer's market to operating seven days a week across multiple markets citywide



Their daily sales have increased from an average of \$30 to over \$300 per day





### **CULTURAL PRESERVATION**

### State Of Illinois Cultural District Designation



On behalf of the Little Village community, the Foundation of Little Village applied to – and was awarded – the Little Village Cultural District designation by the State of Illinois. The community will hold this historic designation for 10 years, which the Foundation will serve as the managing entity.



#### The Little Village Cultural District Designation will:

- Promote a distinct historic and cultural community
- Provide a focal point for celebrating and strengthening the unique cultural identity of the community
- Foster local cultural development and education
- Encourage the preservation and development of historic and culturally significant structures, traditions, and languages
- Encourage economic development and support entrepreneurship in the community
- Promote growth and opportunity without generating displacement or expanding inequality

### **Little Village Cultural District Council**

To guide the vision, planning, and activation of the State-designated Little Village Cultural District, the Little Village Cultural District Council was established.

This council brings together a diverse group of respected and committed community stakeholders, united in their dedication to preserving, celebrating, and elevating the cultural and economic vitality of Little Village.

### The Council is composed of:



Elected Officials who advocate for policies and funding that uplift the district and reflect the community's voice.



Local Businesses and Entrepreneurs who represent the vibrant commercial identity of Little Village and are essential to driving equitable economic development.



Community-Based Organizations that bring deep-rooted experience in education, arts, youth development, public safety, and civic engagement.

### **CORRIDOR REVITALIZATION**

**Xquina Incubator & Café** 

The Xquina Incubator & Café, a key component of the Xquina Business Ecosystem, is a 13,000-square-foot facility that will feature a business incubator, co-working space, café, and shared commercial kitchen. Originally built in the 1880s, the building is being restored, modernized and reintroduced as a spacious business incubator and inclusive community hub, which will honor its past by preserving the original façade and maintaining its place in the history of the community.

#### **Key 2024 Milestones:**







- Achieved 60% overall construction completion
- Replaced the building's steel infrastructure
- Construction officially begins following significant permitting delays
